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ABOUT THE COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENTS

The Indiana Community Action Network (Network) is comprised of 24 Community Action Agencies (CAAs), which serve all 92 counties in Indiana. Every year, the Network analyzes community needs to identify strategies that will work best in addressing poverty.

Additionally, a full-scale Community Needs Assessment is completed by each agency every three years to identify major factors related to poverty and the needs of local residents and their communities. The first full-scale Community Needs Assessments took months of planning, training, research, and implementation of survey work, which resulted in a comprehensive look at the needs of the Network. The first full-scale Community Needs Assessments were completed in 2005.

These 2008 Community Needs Assessments are the second full-scale needs assessments to be completed. The 2008 Statewide Community Needs Assessment report looks at the Network comprehensively and evaluates how the Network is meeting community needs statewide. It is our hope that the Statewide Community Needs Assessment will provide valuable data to the Network and will help the Network to target programs and services to address those with the greatest need in their communities.

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Narrative 1

Client Data and Survey Validity

DIRECT SERVICE STATISTICS - The following demographic data was collected from each agency's Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) data as reported to the State and Federal governments. For more information see the Primary Data section of this report.

KEY FINDINGS

- The Indiana Community Action Network (Network) served a total of 210,926 households and 515,544 individuals in 2007. These numbers mark an increase of approximately 20 percent since 2004 when 180,705 households and 424,730 individuals were served.
- Fifty-one percent of all heads of household were working in 2007 – 42 percent from 2004.
- Two-parent families totaled 33,266 (16 percent) of all households served in 2007.
- In 2007, single parent female-headed households totaled 70,238, accounting for 33 percent of all households served.
- Three percent of households served by the Network in 2007 were single-parent male-headed households.
- Forty-three percent of all people served by the Network in 2007 were children. Of the 221,771 children served: 80,184 were 0 to 5 years old; 74,716 were 6 to 11 years old; and 66,871 were 12 to 17 years old.
- In 2007, the Network served 32,525 senior citizens – those who are 70 years old and older. Seniors accounted for 6 percent of all people served, a decrease from 9 percent in 2004.
- Fifty-eight percent of households served by the Network reported incomes below 75 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG) – \$15,487 for a family of four in 2007. Seventy-one percent of households served had reported incomes below 100 percent of the FPG – \$20,650 for a family of four in 2007. Only 29 percent of households had incomes above 100 percent of the FPG.
- Eight percent of the population served by the Network also received financial assistance from other sources.

- Households served by the Network were generally small in size, with 75 percent having only one to three members. The average household size was 2.44 in 2007.
- Sixty-six percent of the households served in 2007 lived in rental housing.
- Among the 493,139 people served in 2007 who identified a race:
 - Twenty-nine percent were African-American – up from 22 percent in 2004; and
 - Five percent of people served were of Hispanic or Latino origin – up from 3 percent in 2004.
- Thirty percent of people served by the Network in 2007 reported they had no private health insurance.
- Sixty-one percent of adults aged 24 years old or older had a high school diploma or GED. Only 6 percent reported having two or more years of postsecondary education.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA - The following data was collected and are the results of client surveys distributed to Community Action Agencies' clients. For more information see the Primary Data section of this report.

KEY FINDINGS

- Thirty-five percent of CAA client survey households were employed.
- Twenty- nine percent of CAA client survey households were single parent female-headed households and 3 percent of CAA client survey households were single parent male-headed households.
- Sixty-five percent of client survey respondents had a high school diploma or GED, and 7 percent of CAA client survey respondents had either a two or four year postsecondary degree.
- Fifty-two percent of CAA client survey households had incomes below 75 percent of the FPG. Seventy-four percent had incomes below 100 percent of FPG and 26 percent had incomes above 100 percent of FPG.

CLIENT SURVEY VALIDITY

- The Network received 15,092 total surveys, providing a 99 percent confidence level and a 1.01 confidence interval.
- The majority of client surveys were randomly mailed to Community Action Agency (CAA) clients across the state. CAAs with budget limitations were given the option to directly distribute surveys to clients, but were asked to ensure that surveys were distributed randomly and could be returned confidentially.
- The demographics of 2007 client survey respondents were similar to the overall Network population, indicating that the sample used is valid and representative of the population the Network served. Thus, survey data utilized throughout this assessment can be viewed as valid indicators of the entire Network client base.

Narrative 2

Population

POPULATION, INCOME, AND POVERTY STATISTICS - This data was collected from the U.S. Census Bureau and from STATS Indiana. For more information see the Secondary Data section of this report.

POPULATION STATISTICS

- In 2007, Indiana's population was 6,345,289, an increase of 4 percent from 2000, ranking Indiana 15th most populous state in the country. Fourteen percent (876,804) of the state's population lived in Marion County, and a combined 13 percent lived in the next two largest counties, Lake and Allen.
- The median county size in Indiana had a population of approximately 33,500 people. Seventeen Indiana counties had populations of 100,000 people or more, while 20 counties had populations less than 20,000 people.
- The City of Indianapolis is the most populous city in Indiana, and it is the 13th most populous city in the entire country. With 795,458 people living in the city in 2007, Indianapolis is more than three times the size of Indiana's second largest city, Fort Wayne (251,247 people). Two additional cities have populations over 100,000 – Evansville (116,253) and South Bend (104,069). The fifth largest city in the state is Gary, at just under 100,000 people (96,429). Rounding out the top ten are Hammond (77,175), Bloomington (72,254), Fishers (66,080), Muncie (65,410), and Carmel (64,400).
- The population growth rate for Indiana has been well below the national average. From 1990-2000, Indiana's population growth rate was 10 percent, which was the 27th highest growth rate in the country. From 2000-2007, Indiana's population growth rate was 4 percent, ranking Indiana with the 30th highest growth rate in the country. This figure is slightly slower than the growth rate of 7 percent seen by the nation as a whole during the same time period.
- The major areas of population growth in Indiana were in the central Indiana, northeast Indiana, and southeast Indiana. The five highest county growth rates in the state – with growth rates over 17 percent from 2000-2007 – were Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, and Johnson Counties.
- Thirty-six counties experienced declining populations from 2000-2007. Many of these counties are in the north central and east central portions of Indiana, as well as along the Illinois border. The three counties with the highest population declines were Benton, Grant, and Blackford Counties (each experienced a decrease of 6 percent).

- The number of single-parent female-headed households has grown substantially in Indiana, increasing 23 percent from 1990 to 2000. The counties that experienced the largest increases were: Hamilton (85 percent); Switzerland (81 percent); Hendricks (75 percent); Ohio (73 percent); and Steuben (67 percent).
- In 2000, 11 percent of households in Indiana were single-parent female-headed households. This was below the nationwide average of 12 percent – ranking Indiana 28th among all states. Mississippi had the highest rate of single-parent female-headed households at 17 percent and North Dakota had the lowest at 8 percent.
- The counties with the highest proportions of single-parent female-headed households in 2000 were: Lake (17 percent); Marion (15 percent); and Clark, Floyd, and St. Joseph (each at 12 percent). The counties with the lowest proportions of single-parent female-headed households were: Warren and Lagrange (each with 7 percent); and Brown and Carroll (each with 6 percent).
- In 2007, 13 percent of Indiana’s population was 65 years old and older – the same percentage as the nation as a whole. The counties with the highest proportions of people over 65 years old were: Wabash, Fountain, Wayne, and White (each at 17 percent); and Blackford (16 percent). The counties with the lowest proportions of people over 65 years old were: Marion (11 percent); Monroe and Hendricks (each with 10 percent); Tippecanoe (9 percent); and Hamilton (8 percent).
- Nine percent of the total population in Indiana was African-American, ranking Indiana 23rd among all states in the nation in percentage of African-American population. This was below the nationwide average of 12 percent. Mississippi had the highest percentage among states with 38 percent of its total population being African-American, while Montana, Idaho, Vermont, and Wyoming all tied for the lowest percentage of African-American population at 0.6 percent.
- Both Lake County (Gary) and Marion County (Indianapolis) had an African American population of 26 percent; and St. Joseph County (South Bend) and Allen County (Fort Wayne) had an African American population of approximately 12 percent. LaPorte County was the only other county in the state with an African American population over the statewide average, at 10 percent.
- From 1990 to 2000, the Hispanic population in Indiana grew by 117 percent. The counties with the highest growth rates were: Cass (1163 percent); Jackson (812 percent); White (671 percent); Daviess (621 percent); and Crawford (525percent). From 2000 to 2006, the Hispanic population in Indiana grew 39 percent. The counties with the highest growth rates during this time were: Shelby (135 percent); Hamilton (130 percent); Union (127 percent); Hendricks (123 percent); and Switzerland (103 percent).
- In 2007, 5 percent of the total population in Indiana was of Hispanic or Latino origin. The counties with the highest proportion of Hispanics or Latinos were: Lake (14 percent); Elkhart (14 percent); Clinton (13 percent); Cass (11 percent); and Noble (10 percent).

INCOME AND POVERTY STATISTICS

- In 2007, the median household income (MHI) in Indiana was \$47,448, ranking Indiana 31st among all states. Maryland had the highest MHI at \$68,080, while Mississippi had the lowest at \$36,338.

- The Indiana counties with the highest MHIs in 2007 were: Hamilton (\$83,059); Hendricks (\$66,432); Hancock (\$65,421); Boone (\$65,106); and Warrick (\$60,748). While the Indiana counties with the lowest MHIs in 2007 were: Grant (\$37,131); Washington (\$37,288); Vigo (\$37,381); Parke (\$37,932); and Crawford (\$37,942).
- In 2007, Indiana had a poverty rate of 12 percent, or 755,245 people living in poverty, ranking Indiana 28th among all the states. However, Indiana's poverty rate was below the national poverty rate of 13 percent. Mississippi had the highest poverty rate in the nation at 21 percent, while New Hampshire had the lowest at 7 percent.
- From 2000 to 2007, the number of people living in poverty in Indiana increased by 195,761 people and the poverty rate increased by 3 percent.
- In 2007, the counties with the highest number of people living in poverty were: Marion (133,129); Lake (72,971); Allen (37,441); St. Joseph (33,893); and Monroe (29,722). However, the counties with the highest poverty rates in 2007 were: Monroe (26 percent); Tippecanoe (19 percent); Delaware (18 percent); Grant (17 percent); and Knox (17 percent).
- Throughout the state, poverty is concentrated in urban counties. In 2007, Marion County (133,129); Lake County (72,971); Allen County (37,441); and St. Joseph County (33,893) alone accounted for 37 percent of all individuals living in poverty in Indiana.
- In 2007, 8 percent of individuals 65 years old and older in Indiana had incomes below 100 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG). This is below the national average of 10 percent, ranking Indiana 41st among all states. Mississippi had the highest percentage of individuals 65 years old and older with incomes below 100 percent of the FPG at 15 percent; while Wyoming had the lowest number of elderly living below 100 percent of the FPG at 5 percent.
- In 2007, the Indiana counties with the highest poverty rates among individuals 65 years old and older were: Crawford (15 percent); Orange (13 percent); Vermillion (13 percent); Knox (12 percent); and Daviess (12 percent).
- In 2007, 17 percent of children under 18 years old lived in poverty in Indiana. This was below the national average of 18 percent, ranking Indiana 22nd among all states. Mississippi had the highest percentage of children under 18 years old living in poverty at 29 percent, and New Hampshire had the lowest child poverty rate at 9 percent.
- The Indiana counties with the highest child poverty rates in 2007 were: Parke (28 percent); Crawford (27 percent); Grant (25 percent); Knox (24 percent); and Lake (24 percent).
- A leading indicator of poverty, particularly for children under five years old, is being in a single-parent female-headed household. Forty-three percent of these families in Indiana, in 2000, had incomes below 100 percent of the FPG. The counties with the highest poverty rates among single-parent female-headed households, with children under five years old, were: Crawford (80 percent); Parke (78 percent); Daviess (73 percent); Scott (67 percent); and Vermillion (63 percent).

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON INCOME

- Fifty-two percent of Indiana CAA client survey households had incomes below 75 percent of FPG – less than \$1,073 per month for a family of three in 2007. Seventy-four percent had incomes below 100 percent of FPG – less than \$1,431 per month for a family of three in 2007 – with only 26 percent of client survey households above the 100 percent of the FPG.
- Sixty-two percent of female CAA client survey respondents, who had incomes below 100 percent of FPG, were single-parents.

POVERTY

- In 2000, 26 percent of Hoosiers (1,518,047 people) were living below 200 percent of FPG. The counties with the highest percentages of people living below 200 percent of FPG in 2000 were Orange (38 percent); Crawford (38 percent); Daviess (38 percent); Knox (37 percent); and Scott (36 percent). However, the counties with the largest number of people living below 200 percent of FPG in 2000 were: Marion (236,321); Lake (134,923); Allen (79,877); St. Joseph (67,820); and Vanderburgh (46,719).
- The Indiana Self-Sufficiency Standard is a detailed calculation of the amount of income a family needs to meet all its basic needs and is roughly twice the federal definition of poverty or 200 percent of the FPG. When these incomes and wages are used, the actual numbers and percents of people who need assistance increases dramatically. In 2005, the self-sufficiency standard wage for a two-parent household with one pre-school child and one schoolage child (family of four) was \$20.16 an hour or \$42, 580 a year in Marion County. For this same family type in Knox County, the self-sufficiency standard wage is \$15.07 per hour or \$31,818 a year.
- In 2006, the number of people receiving Food Stamps totaled 570,651 – a 44 percent increase from 2002.
- In 2006, 50,262 families in Indiana received Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) benefits marking a decrease of 3 percent from 2005.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON POVERTY

- Over half of Indiana CAA client survey respondents received Food Stamps, a decrease from 58 percent in 2004. Of those who received Food Stamps 5 percent were employed.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Fighting poverty is not just altruistic; it is a key economic development strategy. Based on CAA client survey data, if we could move each of the families served by the Network to at least 100 percent of the FPG, it would generate an additional \$1,845,422,016 per year in income. This money would then be spent in the community, further stimulating local economies.

Narrative 3

Education and Employment

EDUCATION AND EMPLOYMENT – This data was collected from each agency’s Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) data as reported on to the State and Federal governments, 2008 Indiana Community Action Agencies client survey data, and the U.S. Census Bureau. For more information see both the Primary and Secondary Data sections of this report.

EDUCATION

- In 2000, 82 percent of Hoosiers 25 years old and older possessed a high school diploma. This ranked Indiana 26th among all states.
- The counties with the highest rates of people 25 years old and older with a high school diploma in 2000 were: Hamilton (94 percent); Hendricks and Monroe (each at 89 percent); and Boone and Porter (each at 88 percent). The counties with the lowest rates of people 25 years old and older with a high school diploma were: Crawford, Daviess, Scott, and Switzerland (each at 71 percent); and Lagrange (60 percent).
- In 2000, 19 percent of people 25 years old and older in Indiana had a Bachelor’s Degree. This percentage was lower than the national average of 24 percent, which ranked Indiana 43rd among all states.
- The counties with the highest rates of people 25 years old and older with a Bachelor’s Degree in 2000 were: Hamilton and Monroe (each at 40 percent); Tippecanoe (33 percent); Boone (28 percent); and Marion (25 percent). The counties with the lowest rates of people 25 years old and older with a Bachelor’s Degree in 2000 were: Crawford, Fayette, Jennings, Pike, Starke, and Switzerland (each at 8 percent).
- In 2007, CSBG data showed that 61 percent of clients 25 years old and older possessed a high school diploma or GED. Additionally, 6 percent of clients served by the Network had earned either a two year or a four year postsecondary degree. This is an increase from 2004 when 52 percent of clients 25 years old and older had a high school diploma or GED, and only 4 percent of clients had a two or four year postsecondary degree.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON EDUCATION

- Among the 15,092 client survey respondents, 65 percent had a high school diploma or GED and 8 percent had a two year postsecondary degree or higher.
- Education level is a major indicator of the earning potential of family income. Among CAA client survey respondents who were 25 years old and older, those with a high school diploma or GED earned on average about \$184 more per month than those without. Previously, in 2004, the average difference between the incomes of high school graduates and non-graduates was \$130 per month.
- Postsecondary education is becoming increasingly important to the earning potential of families. In 2007, for CAA client survey respondents, 25 years old and older, and without any postsecondary education, the average monthly income was \$830, while those with a postsecondary certificate reported incomes of \$894. Clients with a two year postsecondary degree reported a monthly income of \$1,246; and those with a four year postsecondary degree had a monthly income of \$1,281.

EMPLOYMENT

- In 2006, Indiana had 3,271,496 people in the labor force, which was a 4 percent increase from 2000. The counties that experienced the highest increases in number of people in the labor force were: Hamilton (32 percent); Hendricks (24 percent); Hancock (16 percent); and Boone (15 percent). The counties that experienced the greatest decrease in number of people in the labor force were: Fayette (12 percent); White (11 percent); Steuben (10 percent); and Cass (8 percent).
- In 2007, the unemployment rate in Indiana was 5 percent – same as the national unemployment rate, ranking Indiana 22nd among all states. However, Indiana's 5 percent unemployment rate was an increase from 3 percent in 2000.
- In 2007, the counties with the highest unemployment rates were: Fayette (11 percent); and Crawford, Grant, Lawrence, and Madison (each at 6 percent). The counties with the lowest unemployment rates in 2007 were: Hamilton, Daviess, Dubois, and Hendricks (each at 3 percent).

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON EMPLOYMENT

- Among those served by the Network in 2007, about half (51 percent) of all heads of households were working. This is an increase from the 42 percent in 2004.
- Based on the 15,092 for CAA client surveys returned, 28 percent of respondents were employed. This is an increase from 24 percent in 2004.
- When looking at the CAA client survey responses for those under 65 years old, the employment rate increases to 38 percent, up from 34 percent in 2004. Additionally, 48 percent of CAA client survey households, with adults under the age of 65 years old, had at least one adult working. This is an increase from 40 percent in 2004.

- Forty-four percent of single-parent CAA client survey respondents were working, which is an increase from 39 percent in 2004.

EARNINGS AND OCCUPATIONS

- In 2007, the median family income in Indiana was \$57,734 – ranking Indiana 33rd among all states. Maryland had the highest median family income at \$82,404, while Mississippi ranked the lowest with \$44,769.
- A key indicator of yearly household income is number of hours worked (increased hours worked having a far greater impact on overall income than an increase in hourly wage). Of those CAA client survey respondents who were employed, nearly two-thirds (62%) worked less than 36 hours per week. When accounting for spouses, 55 percent worked less than 36 hours per work. These figures are similar to the 2004 statewide averages of 62 percent and 52 percent respectively.
- In 2000, 13 percent of Indiana’s occupations were in the production sectors, ranking Indiana first in the nation for the most employment in this sector. Nine percent of Indiana’s jobs were transportation and material moving occupations ranking Indiana 6th nationally, while installation, maintenance, and repair occupations represent 5 percent of all jobs, ranking Indiana 8th in the nation. While office and administrative support (16 percent) and sales (10 percent) occupations were two of the three largest occupational sectors in the state, these job sectors represent a smaller proportion of Indiana’s workforce than most other states ranking Indiana 47th and 44th respectively.

Narrative 4

Other Indicators

OTHER INDICATORS OF POVERTY - This data was collected from each agency's Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) data as reported to the State and Federal governments, 2008 Indiana Community Action Agencies client survey data, and the U.S. Census Bureau. For more information see both the Primary and Secondary Data sections of this report.

HOUSING

- In 2007, 58 percent of clients served by the Network were renters. This is higher than the statewide average rate of 26 percent. Nationally, 31 percent of housing units were renter occupied.
- A key indicator of poverty is the percentage of household income spent on rent. According to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, if a person spends over 30 percent of household income on housing their housing is considered to be unaffordable. In 2007, 42 percent of rental households in Indiana spent over 30 percent of their income on rent.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON HOUSING

- Among CAA client survey respondents, 48 percent spent more than one-third of their income on rent.
- Seventy-six percent of CAA client survey respondents stated that they were satisfied with their housing situation.
- Three percent of CAA client survey respondents experienced homelessness in the last 12 months. When projecting the current rate out to the entire Indiana CAA client population, an estimated 7,171 Hoosiers families have experienced homelessness at some point in the last 12 months.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON CHILD CARE

- Access to child care for parents is essential to gain and sustain employment. In 2007, only 12 percent of CAA client survey respondents used child care services on a regular basis. Of those, 44 percent received assistance in paying for their child care costs. For those respondents under 40 years old, only 24 percent used child care services on a regular basis.
- The use of child care services increased to 29 percent among CAA client survey respondents who were employed. Child care service utilization increased to 34 percent among CAA client respondents who worked at least 36 hours per week.
- In 2007, 63 percent of Indiana CAA client survey respondents stated they were satisfied with the care their children received, down from 74 percent in 2004. In addition, 15 percent of CAA client survey respondents stated they had trouble finding or keeping quality child care services.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON CHILD SUPPORT

- For single-parent families, child support is a crucial income source to help these families meet their basic needs. In 2007, 33 percent of client survey respondents were eligible to receive child support, but only one-third of those families (34%) actually received their support regularly over the last year.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON HEALTH INSURANCE

- Sixty-seven percent of CAA client survey respondents, who are employed, did not have private health insurance, indicating that the majority work in jobs with little to no health insurance benefits. Additionally, 83 percent of CAA client survey respondents, who are employed, did not have private health insurance for any member of their family, demonstrating that employer health care benefits are limited or non-existent for workers and their families.
- Many low-income families rely on public health insurance, as 78 percent of CAA client survey respondents throughout the state had at least one member of their family covered by Hoosier Healthwise, Medicaid, or Medicare, this is down from 83 percent in 2004.
- Eight percent of CAA client survey respondents stated that neither they as individuals nor their family had private or public health insurance, this is a decrease from 10 percent in 2004. Projecting that statistic out to the entire Indiana CAA client population, between 14,765 and 18,983 families across the state had no health insurance of any kind in 2007.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON TRANSPORTATION

- Twenty-nine percent of CAA client survey respondents do not have a car in working order. Of these, 55 percent considered this to be a barrier or problem, and 45 percent felt they could acquire better employment if they had reliable transportation.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON OTHER KEY INDICATORS

- Eight percent of Indiana CAA client survey respondents stated they had trouble reading or writing English.
- Fifty-three percent of CAA client survey respondents received Food Stamps. Of those, over half (53 percent) still needed to use food banks occasionally.
- Five percent of CAA client survey respondents stated that either they or a member of their family had been a victim of domestic abuse in the last 12 months.
- In our ever-increasing digital society, computer skills and access to the Internet are becoming increasingly important to economic success. Only thirty-seven percent of CAA client survey respondents had access to the internet.
- Twenty-four percent of CAA client survey respondents stated they could remember receiving government assistance as a child.

CLIENT SURVEY DATA ON NEEDS

- In 2007, over one-third of CAA client survey respondents (38 percent) statewide had a major family or social service need. This is substantially lower than 53 percent in 2004.
- The top three types of assistance needed by CAA client survey respondents were: emergency rent, utilities, or shelter (each at 57 percent); food and nutrition services (each at 35 percent); and better information about services that are available to them (30 percent).

Narrative 5

Data Sources

SOURCES AND INSTRUCTIONS

CLIENT SURVEY DATA

- Survey data used throughout this assessment was generated from a statewide process conducted in late 2007 and early 2008, as well as, an earlier process the first half of 2005. Each Community Action Agency surveyed a random sample of their service population. The raw data results of these surveys have been included.
- One can access the data electronically in the “INCAA Survey Data 2008” file. Several base reports are included in the “Reports” section. This section also allows the user to run base reports by agency, and for the client survey report, by program, county, city, and zip code. Additionally, all outcome and open-ended survey data is available in reports in this section.
- Some of the narrative provided previously is based on cross tabs built within the survey database. These can be found in the “INCAA Survey Data 2008” file, and the user has the option to build more of their own. To access these, hold the “shift” key while double clicking on the file, and click on “queries”. The relevant queries begin with the filename “Crosstab” followed by the corresponding section in the narrative (such as “Pop” or “EmpEd”), followed by the subject of the query.

SECONDARY DATA

- Sources and links to secondary data are provided in the last worksheet of the file “CAA Secondary Data 2008.”
- Some analysis in the narrative section was provided using geographic comparison tables, which can be accessed through the Census Bureau web site. For Indiana statistics, Stats Indiana is the easiest way to get this information. Simply go to the web site (<http://www.stats.indiana.edu>), and you can search for data by topic, geography, or time period.

- Another useful feature on the Stats Indiana web site is the county profiles. With these, one can get a snapshot of key data for each county, and one can get a profile for a custom region by combining county data. Again, go to the web site (<http://www.stats.indiana.edu>), click on “Counties” under the Indiana tab, and here, select the county. To create a custom region, click on “Custom Region,” and hold the “shift” key while selecting counties. When finished, click “Get Profile.”

MAPS

- All of the maps provided in this publication are from the Stats Indiana web site, and there are many more on the site than provided here. To access them, go to the web site (<http://www.stats.indiana.edu>), and on the left there is a section called “Find Maps”. Click on “Thematic Maps” to choose from a wide list of maps with various data elements, or click on “Boundary Maps” to choose from a wide list of maps based on geographic boundaries.

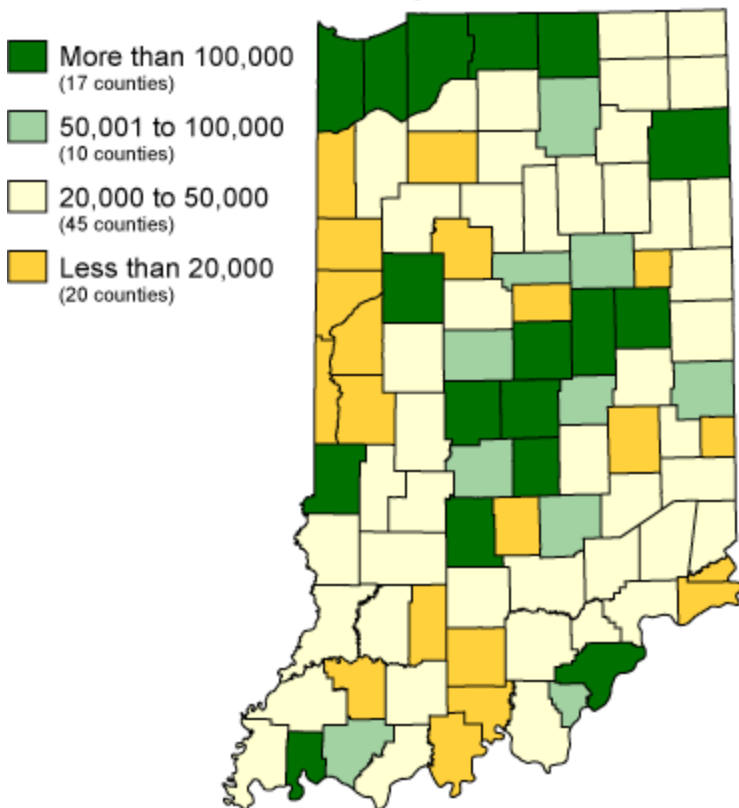

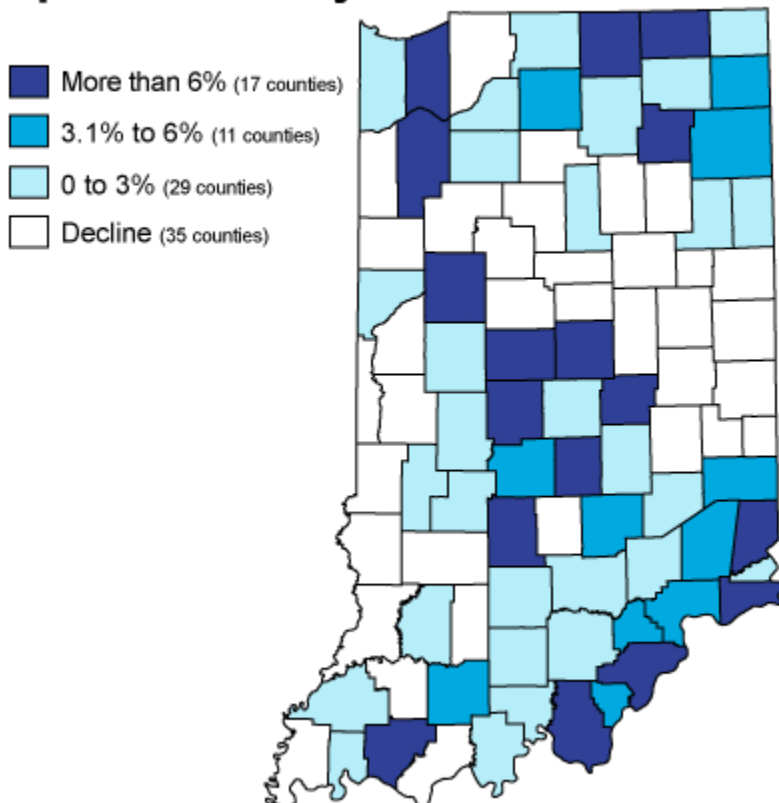
County Population and Changes

Percent Change in Population, April 2000 to July 2007



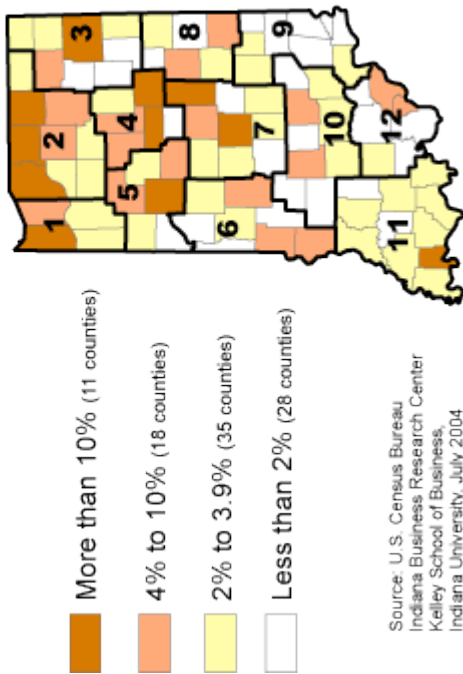

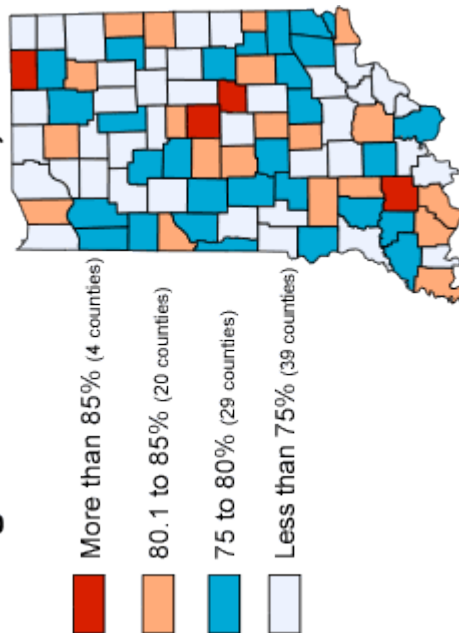
Commerce Regions

Percent of Population, Nonwhite, 2000



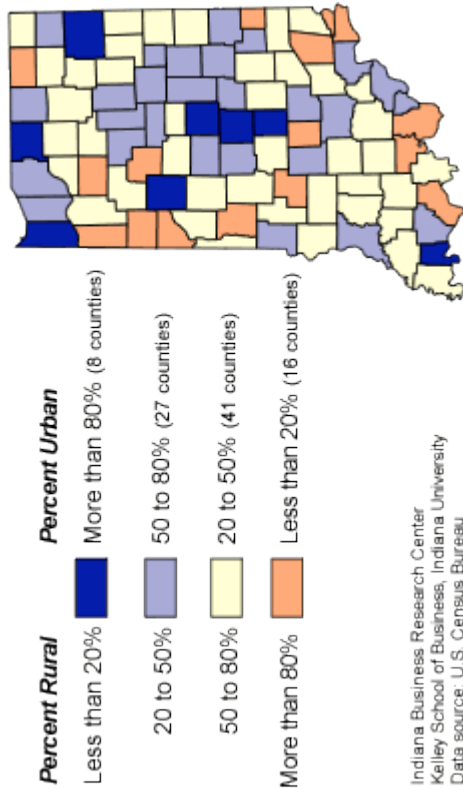

Percent of Children Under 6 Living with Both Parents, 2000



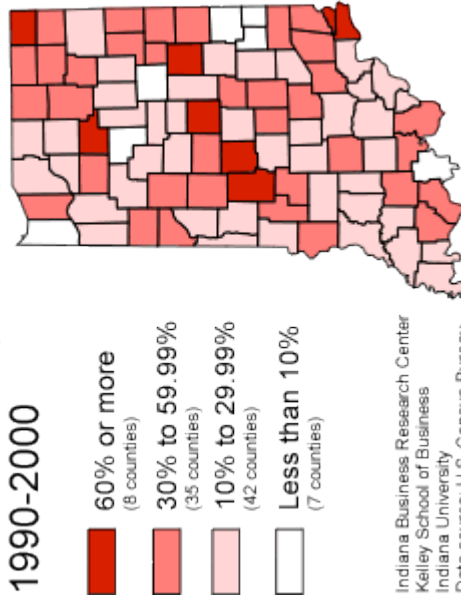

Percent Change in Single Mothers 1990-2000

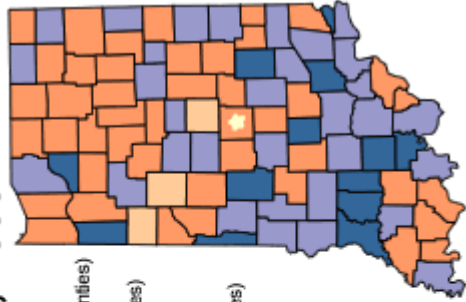

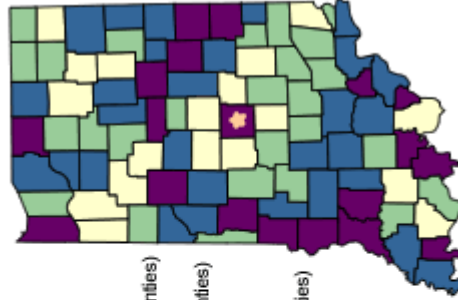
Percent of Individuals over 65 Living in Poverty, 2000

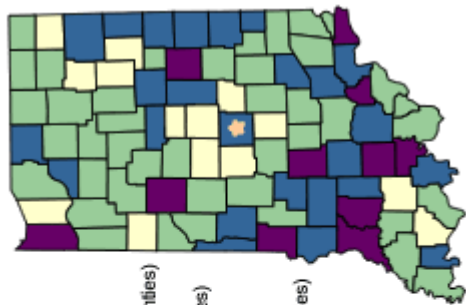
Percent of Families with Children Under 5 Living in Poverty, 2000

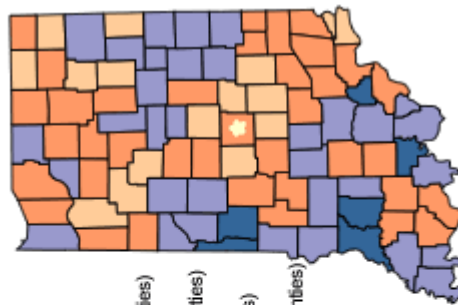
Percent of Individuals Living in Poverty, 2000

Percent of Single Mothers with Children Under 5 Living in Poverty, 2000



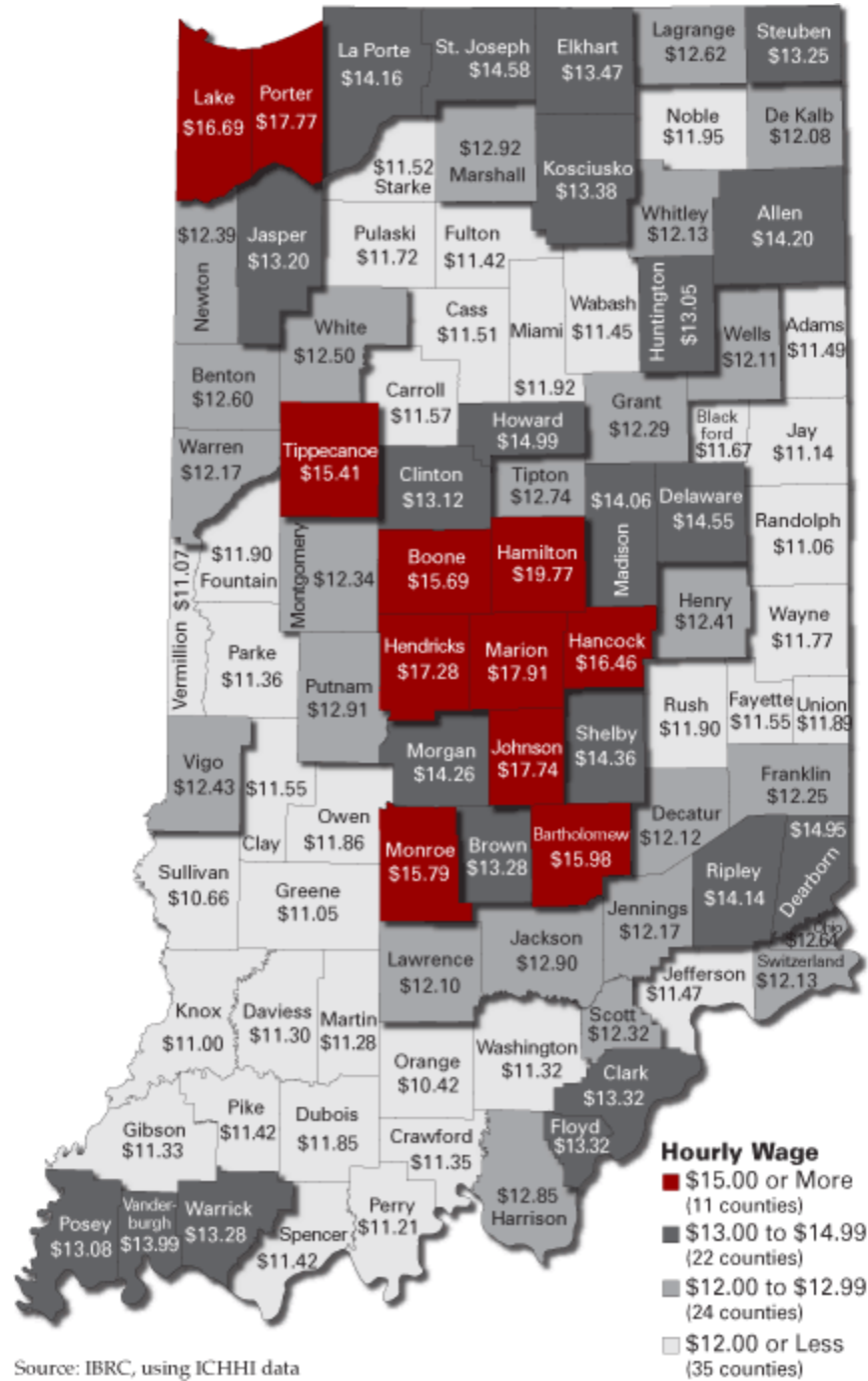

Indiana Self-Sufficiency Standard Map

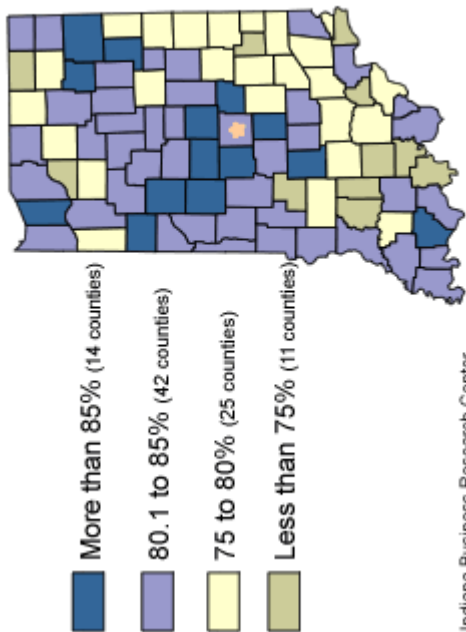
Hourly Self-Sufficiency Wages Needed for Support for a Single Parent with One Infant and One Preschooler

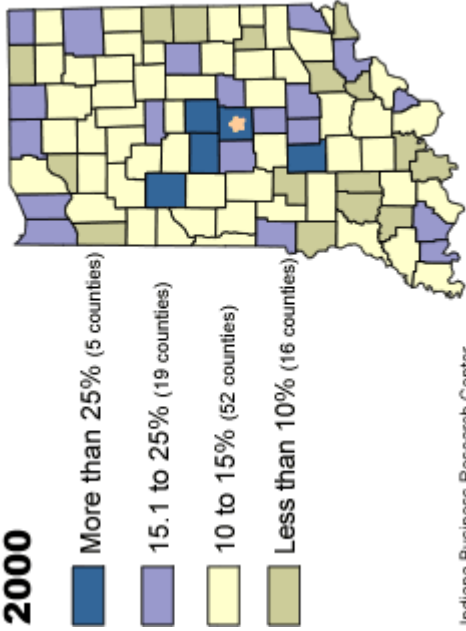
Education and Income Maps

Percent of Population (25 and older) with a High School Diploma, 2000



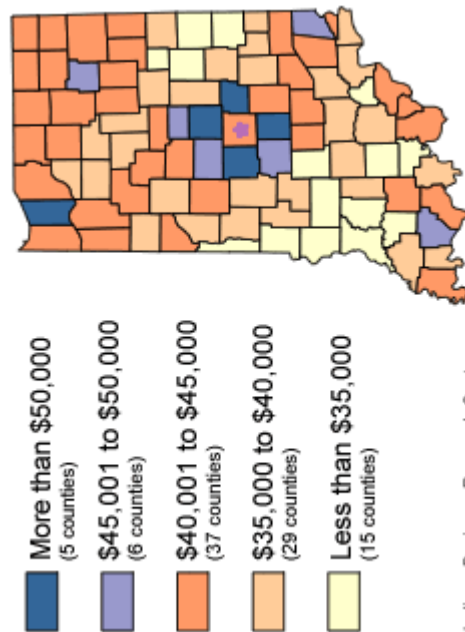

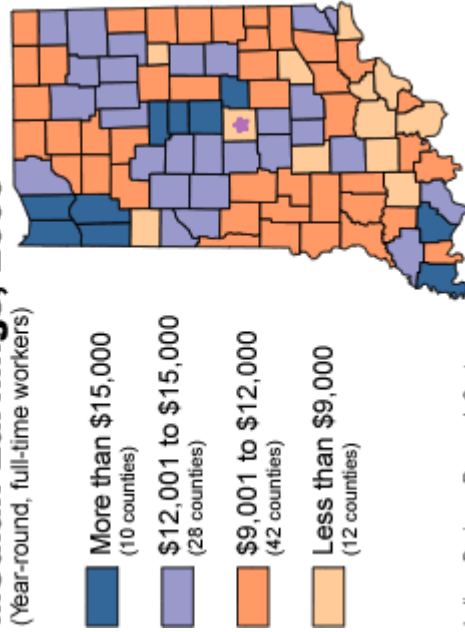
Median Household Income, 2000
